

Faculty – Divine Mercy University, Associate or Assistant Professor of Philosophy or Theology.

The Divine Mercy University (DMU) northern VA invites applications for a full-time philosophy or theology faculty position in its graduate psychology programs. DMU offers programs that integrate psychological sciences and counseling with the Catholic understanding of the person, marriage, and family (www.divinemercury.edu). The applicant should be interested in contributing to a dialogue between Catholic philosophy and theology and mental health practice.

The applicant would work as a member of the DMU Department of Integrative Studies, while assignments would be to the School of Counseling's online Clinical Mental Health Counseling program and the Institute for the Psychological Sciences' (IPS) online Masters of Science in General Psychology program.

Responsibilities include teaching in the different programs, mentoring, supporting dissertation research for the IPS, service to the institution and its programs, and scholarly research.

Applicant must have the following minimum qualifications: (1) a doctoral degree in philosophy or theology from a regionally-accredited institution; and (2) evidence of recent relevant work in the field, including teaching, research, scholarly publications.

The position is aimed at an entry level candidate (Associate or Assistant Professor). Rank and salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications.

The position would begin as soon as the position is filled. The length of the contract is one year, renewable for 3 years based upon a favorable performance review at the end of the first academic year.

The position will be located in Sterling, Virginia. However, given the online nature of several of the programs, the applicant would not be required to be present on campus, except for occasionally needed onsite work or projects.

Applicants should submit a current curriculum vitae, unofficial transcripts for all post-secondary education, letters of reference from three higher education professionals, and a cover letter of interest that addresses the applicant's experience and compatibility with the DMU program and mission by e-mail to facultyrecruitment@divinemercury.edu. Review of applicants is ongoing until positions are filled.
